

## Who assists you in addition?

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We have listed some organizations and institutions below that assist you in various issues regarding academic studies:

### Qualification

At Anabin, (Informationssystem zur Anerkennung ausländischer Bildungsabschlüsse, German only) you can find out whether your certificates are sufficient for studying in Germany.

The DAAD (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst) contains German and internationally oriented Bachelor's, Master's and doctoral programmes, but also language and special courses - and a well-respected ranking comparing higher education institutions and subjects.

International applicants generally come to a German state institution of higher education by means of the „Arbeits- und Servicestelle für ausländische Studienbewerbung“, (in short: Uni-Assist University Application Service for International Students).

### Language

The TestDaF is a language test for foreign learners of German who plan to study in Germany or who require recognised certification of their language skills.

The German exams offered by the Goethe-Institut correspond to the levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and range from level A1 for beginners to C2 for the most advanced language learners.

### Financing

With regard to BAföG (Bundesausbildungsförderungsgesetz; German Federal Education Assistance Act), the Bundesministerium für Bildung und Forschung (BMBF; German Federal Ministry of Education and Research) provides comprehensive information.

With regard to scholarships the Bundesministerium für Bildung und Forschung (BMBF; German Federal Ministry of Education and Research) gives an overview.

With regard to financing of studies the Deutsche Studentenwerk (DSW; German National Association for Student Affairs) provides information.

### Social matters

The BAG Behinderung und Studium e.V. (Disability and Studying) provides assistance for disabled and chronically ill students.

The German Student Union (DSW) provides comprehensive information with regard to the topic Academic Studies and Disability.

### Internships

The Jobbörse of the Bundesagentur für Arbeit (job board of the Federal Employment Agency) also offers a directed search for internships.
